#### Komatsubara Persecution Service Nov. 9, <u>10:30 a.m.</u> (Sun)

The Third of Four Major Persecutions in Nichiren Shonin's life. Before sunset on November 11, 1264, Nichiren was ambushed in the forests of *Komatsubara*, in current Chiba Prefecture. He was on his way to a devout follower's residence after secretly visiting his sick mother. He was wounded in the ensuing attack, while two followers were killed.

#### Special Dharma Talk

For this year's Overseas Minister's Seminar, we learned a new style of giving sermons. This is a more formalized way of giving sermons. In Nichiren Shu, there are many certifications one can choose from such at *Shoho-shi* (kito blessing specialist), ⇒

*⇔Shomyo-shi* (ritual master), *Reidan-shi* (divination specialist), and Fukyo-in (master of preaching). It is this last certification that grants one to be able to conduct "raised platform preaching." This style is like rakugo (Japanese verbal comedy) where the storyteller sits on a raised platform with only a paper fan and towel to use as props. With Fukyo-in, they also use sutra book, incense container, flower petals, and juzu as props.

I have heard several priests give "raised platform preaching" and it is very captivating! The storytelling is done in away where difficult Buddhist concepts are broken down and easier to understand. Sometimes the speaker acts out a conversation using

The version we were taught was made for the English speaking audience. It is still a work in progress, but each one of us priests were able to give our Dharma Talk at various temples to the pilgrims from Southeast Asia. I gave mine on September 12 at Ryukoji Temple in Kamakura City. This just happened to be the day when Nichiren Shonin's fourth of four major persecutions was being commemorated. I had my talk prepared but made last minute adjustments to commemorate this special day.

During Kannon Temple's Oeshiki Service, I gave the same Dharma Talk that I did in Japan so that followers here can experience this new style of sermon. Unfortunately, I forgot to record the Zoom meeting, so I do not have a copy of my talk, but I do have the original version from Japan. I am in the process of trying to transcribe it, so that those who have missed it can enjoy it as well.

In the future, I am planning to conduct more Dharma Talks in this special style, most likely during big services. I will keep everyone posted on when I will present my next Dharma Talk.

## Daibo Hongyoji Temple

This year's Overseas Minister's Seminar was held at Ikegami Honmonji's Daibo Hongyoji Temple. This temple is located on the lower level from the main temple which sits on top of a hill. Daibo was the place where Nichiren Shonin passed away.

By early September 1282, Nichiren Shonin was not feeling well and was on his way to a hot spring when he visited one of his follower's house, the Ikegami brothers. Once there, he was too weak to continue and stayed there until his passing. The residence later was converted to a temple.

There are two parts of the temple complex, the main hall and Daibo. Daibo is towards the back and is the actual building where Nichiren passed away.

Inside the small hall contains the remnants of the post which Nichiren used to prop himself up to give his final Dharma Talk and later passed into Parinirvana.

There is a small portion of the post set aside where the public can go and touch. Every time I visit Ikegami Honmonji, I pay my respects and go touch this post, hoping that



I can absorb some of Nichiren's wisdom.

This time as it was a special occasion with overseas ministers and pilgrims from SE Asia, a special service was held where after incense offering, we could go and touch the actual post in the middle of the hall and not just the cut-out version.

I felt moved that I could touch part of our founder's history.
