My Penang, Malaysia Trip

I had an opportunity to visit SE Asia, specifically Penang, Malaysia for study class where I learned the finer points of ritual and duties of being a Nichiren Shu priest. It was tough, as old habits are hard to break, but was necessary in making sure that I am following proper protocol. It is difficult being by myself as there is no one around to critique me. If I was in Japan, there are more opportunities to be critiqued, so when this study class came up, I wholly embraced it.

The members of the Penang Temple, Ichinenji were outright exuberant for my visit. They all hold my father in high regards, as he was the catalyst in creating the now revitalized mission of Nichiren Shu in SE Asia. Though I am not my father, they have all heard about me and my missionary work and were happy that they could finally meet me in person. In *Hokkien* (the local Chinese dialect) I am referred to as "Rev. Kanai JR!"

It was interesting to see how other cultures chant and practice Nichiren Shu. The members are all very gung-ho. Some visit temple after work to chant *Odaimoku* for an hour. On Thursdays, they get together for service with Dharma talk afterwards. During this service, many of the members take turns being *kinza* (hitting the large bell), *mokusho* (hitting the round wooden mallet) and *taiko* (large drum). It was inspirational to see the members actively participating in service. Someday I too hope to have members participate in conducting service.

All of what the other priests and I learned was applied to the Late Overseas Ministers Memorial Service on Sunday to show the congregation what a formal Nichiren Shu service looks like. Me being *Shuho-shi*, I incorporated *kito* blessing into the memorial service so that everyone could experience this type of special blessing. Later, I also blessed two cars for those who requested special *kito* blessing. ⇒

⇔Over lunch, many members had various questions about Buddhism and Nichiren Shu. For the next five to six hours, I continued to answer questions on various topics. I cannot recall what I spoke about, but it was it was all encompassing. I think they appreciated a native English speaker who could bring a different perspective on explaining Nichiren Shu. As the social hall became too loud with various conversations, we moved to the study hall where I had the use of a white board and microphone. This impromptu discussion became a full Dharma Talk session! In a quieter room, everyone was able to hear and understand my answers. One of the members called her sister in New Zealand to remotely listen to my talk via phone! I thought they were just using the phone to record my talk but instead it turned out to be a long distance call! I even answered many of her questions she had afterwards.

I really appreciated the hospitality and eagerness to learn from the members. Our time together was short, but we used the time wisely. Someday I will visit Penang again and this time have a full Lecture series prepared!

Note: If you do visit SE Asia, be prepared to eat. I gained at least five pounds from all the wonderful restaurants and prepared meals. I was always asked, "Are you still hungry?" and "Did you have enough to eat?"

The impression of Las Vegas = Casino is strong; therefore I don't think anyone knows that about an hour car drive from the city is a ski resort.


