

### Endeavor!

What an interesting year 2016 has been! Especially in America where a new President was elected after a very long heated campaign from both sides. Agree or disagree with the government, continue to chant *Odaimoku* for all people in order for everyone to be able to realize their own Buddha nature thus realizing peace on earth.

It is a tradition to make a New Year's Resolution, such as quit smoking, go to the gym, lose weight. But for many, these resolutions are usually broken by the end of the first week of the new year and entirely forgotten by the end of the month. It is always hard to start something new (or something old if the case may be) and sticking with it. People make grand goals which is hard to obtain thus easier to quit when goals cannot be met.

Just as in our daily Buddhist practice, it is hard to study everything. Buddha has taught many parables and preached many sutras. Where to start? This can be confusing to most practitioners and even harder for beginners. In the beginning, start small. Set easy goals, such as being able to chant the *Odaimoku*, "Namu Myoho Renge Kyo". Then being able to chant *Odaimoku* faster and faster without getting tongue-tied. The next step will be to learn Japanese pronunciations to read the Lotus Sutra in Japanese. The reason for reading in Japanese is that there is a certain tone/beat that is rhythmical thus meditative. Then as you begin to master pronunciations correctly, again start chanting slowly then gradually pick up speed.

As you being slowly working your way in being able to chant the Lotus Sutra, now would be a good time to start learning more in depth of Buddhism, especially Nichiren Shu. Buddhism needs to be practiced thus the chanting, but we also must cultivate the mind. When we are able to control the mind then we are able to control ourselves, thus be able to elevate our consciousness into becoming closer to being a Buddha ourselves. We all have the seed in becoming a Buddha, practice and learning is essential. This is what St. Nichiren stressed in his writings.

My goal this year is to help elevate everyone to practice and learn. I am available any time to help with either chanting, study or both.


### What's PPAP?

It is a currently trending on YouTube around the world. *Pico Taro* who is a middle age Japanese singer/song writer dances with a rhythm of his own way wearing a costume of animal pattern and a long scarf. ### The Lotus Sutra for Children

A Happy New Year to All of You!

Since I semi-retired one and half years ago, I devote myself in translating the 30 volumes of "Minwa-fu Hokyo Dowa" by Rev. Koge Matsumoto. I would like to share this book with you to the English speaking people.

At first Rev. Matsumoto heard a message from Sakyamuni Buddha, "To write a folk tales on the Lotus Sutra for children!" on December 24, 1986. She was a laywoman at that time and did not know what to do. So she asked Professor Eishu Miyazaki of Minobusan University. He told her that she should write and publish a book in 30 volumes – the first volume is for the story of Sakyamuni Buddha and the last one is for the story of Nichiren Dai'Shonin and in between are one volume each for the 28 chapters of the Lotus Sutra. So she said, "I don't have that kind of money." He said, "Don't worry that kind of money will arise!" So she decided to become a Nichiren Shu priest and began to write the first volume. She had hard time to write the first volume, but rest of the volumes she wrote more like auto writing. The pen she holds move very smoothly.

The first volume was published on December 1, 1987 and presented it to many well-known people in Nichiren Shu and friends. She wrote it with standing point of a mother and a Nichiren Shu priest. It took for eight years to publish all 30 volumes.

It has taken for me one and half years since I started to translate each book one after another up to volume 17. It may take another two years to complete the translation of the rest of the volumes. Please read the story volume by volume in order, so that you will understand what Sakaymuni Buddha revealed in the Lotus Sutra.

This book is not only for children but for anyone who is interested in the Lotus Sutra. Please read it to increase your understanding of the sutra!
