Matryoshka

Recently, I finished the "Study Class on Buddhism" that was started by my father. The course begins with the book "The Teaching of Buddha" by *Bukkyō Dendo Kyōkai* where we learn the basics about Buddhism. Then we move to "Nichiren" by *Jack Christensen*, where we learn about our founder, Nichiren Shonin. Finally, we can start on the *Lotus Sutra*. To complete the entire course takes over ⇨

↳three years.

Buddhism is not easy, especially the teachings of the *Lotus Sutra*. Through perseverance, one can gain but a small understanding of Sakyamuni Buddha's ultimate Teaching.

Through many iterations of teaching this course, I gained a little bit of knowledge. Each time I learn something new. The written words do not change, but the underlying meaning does. Sometimes the words jump out, and I notice a phrase that I previously did not consider. I was trying to come up with an analogy but could only come up with "peeling back the layers of an onion."

An onion is a bit pungent and not really a great analogy to use when talking about the *Lotus Sutra*. Then one day looking over some artwork, I saw Russian nesting dolls. That's it! The *Lotus Sutra* is just like a nesting doll. As we admire the outer doll, we figure out there is another doll inside. Then, after opening to reveal this new smaller doll, we realize again that there is another smaller doll inside and so forth until reaching the last little doll. Instead of peeling back layers of an onion, I think the revelation of another doll is much better as it reflects our wonderment towards this new realization.

As our faith and knowledge grows, we too grow in gaining deeper insight into the *Lotus Sutra*. It is said, "The Dharma for Bodhisattvas. The Dharma upheld by the Buddhas." Though we are all bodhisattvas, our bodhisattva level leans towards beginner, thus harder to comprehend at first. Through our hard effort, we can start to comprehend the underlying meanings of the various passages. Then when the time is right, the next revelation will reveal itself and so forth.

Everyone continue to study and practice. Your knowledge level will surely increase, thus being able to reveal the underlying doll, and then the next doll, then the next until reaching Buddhahood.

Figs Growing in Winter

The other day as I was about to rake the fallen leaves from my fig tree (due to the warm desert climate, leaves don't fall until December), I noticed some new buds growing on a new branch!

I usually have two harvests, one in early June and another one in August. This is unusual! After the second harvest, I just watch and enjoy the broad green leaves. I didn't expect that I might have a possible third harvest this late in the season.

It has been exceptionally warm during late autumn this year. In early December, it was still reaching a high in the seventies with the low dipping to low fifties! This might have contributed to fruit growing again.

It also could be that the tree could be responding to my mother when she stays over at my house. Every morning before morning prayer in front of the family *butsudan*, she talks to the tree. She touches the younger branches to gain youthful energy. I wonder if the young branches are encouraged to grow as well.

I will leave the buds to see if they can ripen over the next coming days. It is supposed to cool down, so we will have to wait and see what happens. I will report back in the next issue.
