Komatsubara Persecution Service Nov. 8th, 10:30 a.m. (Sun)

The Third of Four Major Persecutions in St. Nichiren's life. Before sunset of November 11, 1264, St. Nichiren was ambushed in the forests of Komatsubara, in current Chiba Prefecture. He was on his way to a devout follower's residence after secretly visiting his sick mother. He was wounded in the ensuing attack, while two followers were killed.

I hope that you do not fall into this category. If you do find yourself in despair, do not worry, there is always a way towards salvation.

Refer to the "Sacred Words." I remember reading this translation when I was younger and used a different dharma book. I always found this passage descriptive and saw the celestial beings moving about in a wonderfully adorned castle above my head. It reminded me that this Saha-world (earth) is actually peaceful and is the Buddha-land. We do not have to travel to the Pure Land in the West to find peace. We have it here.

Sakyamuni Buddha let us know that this is his world. He watches over His world, so He watches over all of us. Since all Buddha-lands are pure, this world is pure as well. We just cannot see it. Due to our defilements, we have cloudy glasses, making it seem like the world is horrible. If we remove the grime, we can see the world as it truly is, peaceful.

Remember this phrase, always. Even when times seem tough, when you recall these words, you will be reassured by the Buddha that He is with you. We are his children; we are living in his house. By following His Teachings, we too can begin to see the world just as He does.

Have faith in the Lotus Sutra and Odaimoku. This will surely lead you to further strengthen your bond with Buddha. Do not keep this just for yourself. Please share this word with others, so that they too can remove the grime and see this world is truly the land of bliss.
