## Archbishop of Nichiren Shu and Chief Abbot of Minobusan Kuon-ji Temple Visits the Oldest and Newest Nichiren Shu Temples in North America

Commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Propagation of Nichiren Buddhism in North America, the most honored Nisso Uchino, Archbishop and the Chief Abbot of Minobusan Kuonji Temple will conduct the Grand Ceremony at the Los Angeles Nichiren Buddhist Temple on June 29<sup>th</sup>. He is said to be a descendant of Lord Hakii who donated all of Mount Minobu to Nichiren Dai'Shonin, the founder of Nichiren Buddhism 740 years ago.

There will be many people from all over Japan coming for this celebration. We would like to welcome the Archbishop and his group with a special banquet on June 28<sup>th</sup>. Our group is still small but the sound of Odaimoku and hand drums will be a warm welcome for Archbishop Uchino's group.

# Outdoor Sunday Service and Picnic Commemorating Nichiren Buddhism Birthday

On April 27<sup>th</sup> we celebrated the birthday of Nichiren Buddhism at the Spring Table Picnic Grounds in Calico Basin on the eastside of Red Rock National Park. As you know Nichiren Dai'shonin chanted "Namu Myo-ho Ren-ge Kyo" for the first time at the top of Mount Kiyosumi on April 28, 1253. When we marched while chanting the Odaimoku with hand drums, some people clapped their hands with the rhythm of the drums and even some children approached to us as we walked by.

Although Las Vegas is surrounded by desert, there are a few places where spring water comes out of the rocks naturally. Such places were used to be the habitations for native aborigines. Therefore, these small areas are covered with green grasses and trees and are very precious even for us today.

During my last visit to America, I was given the opportunity to talk to high school and middle school Social Studies teachers about Buddhism, including my experience in *Aragyo*, which amazed everyone. Some thought that I was crazy to do such a practice. Understandingly, it is very rare to meet someone who has completed ascetic training. There are not many opportunities in America to do such practices. The only comparable experience would be

Special Forces military training. My hope was that I could inspire these teachers to broaden their horizons.

The image of Las Vegas is that of excess and indulgence; an adult playground. Hidden behind this façade, there are amazing people, such as myself. Part of my plan for the future, is to be able do more lectures for teachers and the community, to talk about my experiences. This is one way to spread the message of the Buddha and St. Nichiren to a greater audience and influence them to act according to Buddhist principles. I may even use the sound from my bokken to wake them up!
