The Lotus Sutra and Nichiren (No. 3)

Establishment of the Righteousness and Security of the Nation

Here again we must go back to Nichiren Shonin who entrusted his entire life to the Lotus Sutra. The 13th century was just the beginning of *mappo* or the Declining Latter Age of the Dharma (from 2,000th year after Sakyamuni Buddha's death to 10,000th year). This is the period when doctrine alone is still alive, but there is neither practice nor enlightenment. But this is the time for the true teachings to be revealed. Nichiren sought how to save all these suffering people. The Lotus Sutra is hard for people to believe and hard to practice. We live in the era of *mappo* when there is no salvation. Nichiren's answer was to spread the teachings of the Lotus Sutra and the simple method of chanting the sacred title of the sutra or *Odaimoku*, "Namu Myoho Renge Kyo." The Odaimoku is the remedy for us to cure the blindness to the truth. It contains all merits of the Eternal Buddha; therefore, if you take this remedy, you will receive Buddha's wisdom and compassion, thus you will be liberated from sufferings and

troubles.

Nichiren reached his strong determination to spread the sutra and led people to chant the *Odaimoku*. His first sermon was at Kiyosumi Temple at noon on April 28, 1253. However no one had ears to listen to him, instead he was almost be-headed by a local police chief who had strong belief and faith in Pure-Land Sect. Then Nichiren traveled to the city of Kamakura where political capital of Japan resided at that time.

Although there were many huge temples of different denominations and many famous priests who lived in the temples, they maintained their positions in the Kamakura Government since the government built these temples for the priests to pray for the security of Japan. The original task of Buddhism to save suffering people was forgotten. Because of the many natural disasters, diseases, and starvation, they gave up life on this earth and looked for rebirth in the Pure-Land. There, Nichiren stood at crossroad of Kamakura and preached that we should be saved while we are still alive and expounded the teachings of the Lotus Sutra.

In order to be saved while we are still alive, we must change the government authority's thinking. For Nichiren, these constant disasters were an indication that something was not done right. Unless something was done to end the present calamities and to avert similar disasters in the future, more downfalls were soon to come. He researched all Buddhist doctrines to find the solution to save the county. Finally the quest for peace was set forth clearly in *Rissho Ankoku Ron*.

Nichiren presented this petition to the Kamakura Government. It states, "The government and the people are standing against the Right Law. They believe wrong teachings. Therefore, gods have deserted this country, and saints who protect the people have left us." He continues, "The peace of our country will be realized if slanderers of the Right Law are eliminated and keepers of the Right law are respected." According to Nichiren the slanderers of the Right Law are those priests who threw away the Lotus Sutra and emphasized on being born in the Pureland and those priests who neglected the Lotus Sutra but prayed for the security of Japan with other sutras which do not reveal righteousness. He predicted quoting *Medicine-Master Sutra*, "Five of seven disasters predicted in the sutra have already taken place, leaving just two still to occur; foreign invasions and civil wars." His petition concluded, "You should promptly discard your false faith, and take up the true teaching of the Lotus Sutra at once. Then this triple world of the unenlightened will all become Buddha-Land."

By the way, Eastern Japan was hit with a 9.0 earthquake and tsunami on March 11th, furthermore, with the nuclear power plants out of commission, and radiation leak made people worry not only in the affected area but also around the world.

I believe these natural disasters were a warning for Japanese people to practice righteousness. It was a warning from gods of Japan. According to Japanese mythology, Izanagi and Isanami, were believed to have created the islands of Japan by dipping a jeweled spear into the sea as they stood on the Floating Bridge of Heaven.

In the 13th Century Japan, Nichiren Shonin, wrote in *Rissho Ankoku Ron*, "Reasons for the natural disasters like earthquake, the tidal waves, famine and disease were indication that something were not done right. God and saints have abandoned this country, and devils and heretics have created calamities. ... The peace of our country will be realized if the slanderers of the Right Law are eliminated and the keepers of the Right Law are respected."

Recently, majority of the Japanese people lost value of their culture and tradition. They do not honor their national flag; do not sing their national anthem at school. They become more self-centered and very materialistic. Some honest people in Japan worry and say that China may invade Japan like what happened to Tibet in 1959. Japanese people are too naïve to protect their own country. Japan depends on the U.S. Military for her security but they try to cut the security treaty between the two countries. Japanese seem to lose loyalty to their mother land. Former ambassador to Japan, Dr. Edwin Reischauer, said that United States sent 500,000 soldiers to Vietnam; America could not protect South Vietnam as long as the people in South Vietnam had no loyalty to protect their own country.

It is now for all Japanese to unite in one spirit to arise again. I heard that many people cancelled their overseas travels and held back any joyful events these days. We wish victims and devastated areas in Eastern Japan will be better than before and have happier life in the near future.

No More Service at the Kannon Temple of Nevada?

"No church worship in residential district" is common in American society. Since Rev. Shokai Kanai has opened a new temple in Las Vegas over three years ago, there were no complaints. In order to expound the Lotus Sutra and Odaimoku; he placed a banner of the temple name and Sunday service advertisement in front of his house. A few weeks later two Code Enforcement Specialists came and gave us a Notice of Violation.

Now we are in the process of obtaining a use permit. We had to turn in many documents to Clark County; as a result, we are scheduled to present our case to the Town Board Meeting and Planning Commission Meeting to seek approval. Even if we are successful in being granted a use permit, we cannot change the appearance of the residential house and we are not able to have regular worship or scheduled services.

We need your help in purchasing a new building with enough space for parking to be able to meet the county codes.

We sincerely request your support of any amount towards the building fund. In the meantime we are still continuing *Shakyo* as part of the building fund donation. We wish to celebrate the Fifth Anniversary and Open Temple in fall, 2012.

A Narrow Escape

I would like to extend my sincere sympathy to the people devastated in Eastern Japan by the huge earthquake and tsunami on March 11th.

I have two brothers who live in Japan; the elder one in Abiko, Chiba and the younger one in Yokohama. I found out through e-mail that all the family members were safe and I was relieved.

My sister-in-law in Abiko told me over the phone excitedly as follows: "On that day I went to my sumi-e class. On the way back from the class, I was on bicycle. Suddenly the ground shook funny, so I got off the bicycle and pushed it while I walked. (I did not realize it was earthquake). Soon after that I heard behind me a very huge sound of block walls falling down on the sidewalk and roof tiles were sliding down to the ground. If I was one minute late, I might be hit with falling block walls or roof tiles and be injured. Returning home, I found a flower vase and *ihai* or memorial tablets for ancestors were on the

floor, but nothing else was broken or fell. I then finally realized it was an earthquake.

I brought out an emergency aid bag and place at the entrance and prepared to leave the house

anytime with my family. At night I could not changed into pajamas and kept wearing street clothes just

in case I needed to escape quickly and went to sleep."

In another case, I received an email from a friend and said, "I watched T.V. news from Los Angeles,

'Japan had many tragedies and overcame all of them. Japan will surely come back!' I was so touched

with this encouragement. I was full of tears."

A friend of mine in Los Angeles who was from Sendai said, "I contacted my siblings and relatives in

Sendai, but two of them are still missing, so I am lost. But I play guitar to comfort myself and all victims

of the disasters."
