
My View Point (As I heard and as I see)
Lucky Cat in Las Vegas

The Lucky Cat in Vegas is raising her left hand. When you touch the palm, a lucky card comes out of her belly. It has a short message like a fortune cookie, but it is said that there are some free cocktail tickets, free buffet tickets for two, play cards worth of \$5 to \$25, free VIP night club tickets, etc. You have to be 21 years old to touch the palm of the cat.

It is said that the cat’s left arm raised means to invite customers while right arm raised means to invite money. We do not know when and who started it, but the cat symbolizes as a mascot of Family Happiness, Prosperity of Stores in Japanese livelihood.

The Odaimoku is Light

Have you ever wondered why Nichiren Dai’Shonin wrote 南無妙法蓮華經 with semi-cursive writing and some lines stretching from some of the characters written on the *Mandala Gohonozon*?

Those lines represent the rays of light. Do you remember, when Nichiren Dai’Shonin, the founder of our faith, chanted the sacred title of the Lotus Sutra,



“NAMU MYOHO RENGUE KYO” for the first time?
He chanted it facing the rising sun from the horizon of the Pacific Ocean. Then he changed his name from Rencho to “Nichiren (Sun-lotus).” Chapter 21 of the sutra says, “Just as the light of the sun and the moon eliminates all darkness, this person will be able to eliminate the darkness of the living beings of the world.” The rays of the sun remove all darkness without any favoritism. *Odaimoku* chanting will remove all your negative karma instantly just like the rays of the sun remove darkness instantly.

Nichiren said in the letter to Lady Nichinyo, “The names listed on the *Gohonzon* include all Buddhas, Bodhisattvas, saints, and all living beings that appeared in Chapter One of the Lotus Sutra. Each one of them are illumined with the rays of the five characters of *Myo-Ho-Ren-Ge-Kyo*. This is called *Gohonzon* or the Most Honored Object of Worship.” He continued to say, “Do not seek the *Gohonzon* outside of you because you who chant the *Odaimoku* have it within your body.”

He says in *Senkyo Chodai-mon* that illusion creates all bad karma and negative thought. They will be eliminated by chanting *Namu Myo-ho Ren-ge Kyo*.

We must realize those who chant *Odaimoku* are the light. The light brightens you and others. The light may be tiny like a burning stick of match, but it removes fear of darkness and tell you which way you should move. The light removes our fear. The light gives us hope. The light is warm. The light gives you direction.

While you chant, image that you are shining. After your chant, tell yourself, “I am brightening my surrounding with the radiance of *Namu Myoho Renge Kyo*.”

The more you chant the *Odaimoku*, the more you brighten yourself. Then your light may become much brighter like a flashlight or floodlight or even a lighthouse than a burning stick of match. Thus, I try to be a brighter light and so should you.
